The 2017 Conference will focus on the role of music and liturgical dance as art forms that enhance our worship, and perhaps affect what the Altar Guild does to prepare the church for a service.

- To just register for the Annual Conference (dues already paid) -- On P. 2 of the online process, select desired type of room (Double or Single). On P. 3 DO NOT select type of membership.
- Double room & meals for 3 days is \$314. Single room & meals for 3 days is \$428. If cost is an issue, perhaps your parish or Diocese can help!

Registrations are due by Friday May 26, 2017 – after that date, a \$5.00 late fee will be charged. Kanuga will accept reservations as long as space is available.

CHURCHES AROUND THE DIOCESE . . .

Epiphany Episcopal Church (Fort Myers Deanery) 2507 Del Prado Boulevard South, Cape Coral, Florida 33904



Church of The Epiphany is 54 years old. It is one of the oldest three churches in Cape Coral. The oldest church is the subject of much debate!

Epiphany has two very precious gifts. We have an unusual organ that was made in Germany and transported to our church for assembly. This organ is a wonderful musical instrument. In addition, the pipes are arranged in a stunning butterfly shape. Epiphany has also been blessed with beautiful stained glass windows in the Sanctuary and Narthex as well as many other rooms throughout the building. All of the windows were made by Mr. *Jim Yeakey*, one of our parishioners. His wife, the late *Dee Yeakey*, drew the designs for the windows. Dee was the Directress of our Altar Guild for many years and was also active at the Deanery and Diocesan levels of the Altar Guild.

Epiphany has two distinctive organizational models. We are joined with St. John's of Pine Island financially and liturgically. Both churches contribute financially to provide the clergy. **The Reverend Ryan Wright** is the Priest-in-Charge of Epiphany and the Vicar of St. John's. *Reverend Mary Piper* is the Assistant Priest on a seasonal basis. Two deacons also help provide the spiritual needs of both churches. One deacon is retired and one is seasonal.

Three years ago, one of our neighboring churches had the terrible misfortune of losing their church building along with the entire campus. Christ Lutheran Church would have been homeless. Epiphany invited them to share our building. We share the sanctuary and most of the building space. Christ Lutheran is a member of the Evangelical Lutheran Churches of America. This Synod is in Communion with the Episcopal Church, which would enable the two churches to have joint services. However, the two churches maintain their own worship schedules and liturgies except on special days. Sharing space with Christ Lutheran has been a joy and a learning experience for us all.

Our Altar Guild has ten full time, active members. Like many Altar Guilds, our numbers have been reduced by age and illness. However we form a dedicated, talented, sharing team, and maintain the high standards instilled in us by our past Directors.
