This year we will have one of our newer young priests as our celebrant and I know you will all enjoy meeting **The Rev. Canon Katie Churchwell** who is at the Cathedral. We are offering a program that is both practical and fascinating. Many of you enjoy sewing and even have made vestments and other paraments for the church. MEET OUR NEW TREASURER



SUSAN REGAN is a "cradle" Episcopalian who was baptized at St. Peter's (now the Cathedral Church of St. Peter) 69 years ago. Her mother, **Annis deBrigard**, was also baptized at St. Peter's in 1924. After Susan's family spent the first decade of her life in Lansing, Michigan, they moved back to St. Petersburg. By then, Susan's grandmother, **Grace McLean**, had been sent out to help develop St. Bede's, so the family joined St. Bede's for a number of years.

Susan has two brothers: **Scott** and **Stephen Fluharty**. Scott lives in Washington. Stephen lives in Tampa, and attends St. John's with his family. He has served on St. John's Vestry and is very active in ministry there. After Susan's father died at the age of 59, her mother made it possible to have St. Thomas Chapel at DaySpring named in his memory (see article about St. Thomas Chapel in the 2016-1 issue of the **AltarGram**).

Susan married *Jack Regan* in 1975. They attended Holy Cross for a few years and finally "came home" to the Cathedral, where she has been a member of the Altar Guild for a number of years. In addition to her regular altar gguild duties she makes up the duty roster each month -- not the easiest task with daily Eucharist services, in addition to the Sunday services and "brass & candles". Susan also participates as a Lay Reader and a volunteer at "Messy Church", VBS, and LIGHT Dinners. On almost every Friday night, you will find Susan and her husband in Harvard Family Hall at the Cathedral, continuing the movie ministry started by the late long-time parishioner, *Dr. Eddy Burns*.

Susan attended DePauw University. She graduated from the University of Florida with a BFA in Art History, and later obtained a degree in Accounting from the University of South Florida. Susan retired this past December, after having worked as a Certified Public Accountant at the same firm for 26 years. She is looking forward to her new job as Treasurer of the Diocesan Altar Guild.

CHURCHES AROUND THE DIOCESE . . .

Good Samaritan Episcopal Church (Clearwater Deanery) 2165 NE Coachman Road, Clearwater Florida 33765



The Episcopal Church of the Good Samaritan was founded in 1957. The current Parish House first served as the Sanctuary from early 1957 through spring 1964. In May 1964 the Sanctuary was completed and dedicated. It is designed in the shape of an inverted ark (an alternate design to the more familiar long nave with transepts forming the shape of a cross). The beautiful stained glass windows represent the "Works of Mercy" which seems fitting for a church named Good Samaritan.

- Vision: To be "a house of prayer for all people". (Isaiah 56:7).
- **Mission:** To share Jesus by reaching out to others through Christian Love, Bible Study, Worship, Fellowship, and Prayer (paraphrased from *Acts 2:42*)

The Episcopal Church of the Good Samaritan is very blessed to have as its part-time priest-in-charge the *Very Rev. Brian Beno*. In October 2016 Father Beno and his wife *Terry Hansen-Beno* came to Good Samaritan from the Diocese of Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. Currently in mission status, Good Samaritan has a small but vibrant congregation of approximately 120 members. It has an active choir and a handbell ensemble, and occasionally puts on special programs for the community in addition to providing beautiful music for church services. Good Samaritan's Altar Guild has six members. Although she credits the Holy Spirit as the real director, *Lillian Jones* has served as AG directress for at least 20 years, and continues to love this ministry. Lillian and another stalwart faithfully handle the 8:00 service and set up for the 10:00 service. Other members take turns for the 10:00 service so no one else has to be on duty every Sunday.

There are two Sunday Liturgies at 8:00 AM & 10:00 AM. A great fellowship hour follows the 10:00 AM Service. Wednesdays at 10:00 AM Morning Prayer with Holy Eucharist is held in the Chapel.

Choir Rehearsals are on Wednesday from 6:30-8:00 PM, with Handbell Rehearsal following from 8:00-9:00 PM. Thursdays at 6:00 PM is Centering Prayer in the Chapel.

Bishop's Committee meets the 3rd Wednesday at 7:00 PM.

Office Hours are 9:00 AM -12 Noon Monday - Friday.

Thrift Shop Hours are 12 Noon-4:00 PM every Tuesday through Saturday. Good Samaritan's Thrift Shop is staffed by dedicated volunteers and provides a wonderful service to the community. Ten per cent of shop proceeds are tithed back to the church, with the remainder supporting outreach projects or special needs that arise in the church.

Good Samaritan has a very active ECW branch and a dedicated chapter of the Daughters of the King (DOK). The church is a supporting congregation of FAST (Faith & Action for Strength Together), a Pinellas County ecumenical ministry for social justice.
