PRESIDENT'S PAGE

In Chapter 10:38-42 of St Luke's Gospel we read the story of Jesus visiting in the home of Martha and her sister Mary. Mary sat at the feet of Jesus and listened to his teachings, while Martha worked to provide hospitality for him. While Mary seized the opportunity to learn from Jesus, Martha complained because her sister wasn't helping her care for his needs. As members of the Altar Guild we don't have to make that kind of decision. Our altar guild ministry is to provide hospitality to all who would come to his Altar to be fed, while our work gives us a deeper understanding of his ministry and sacrifice.

As a member of Province IV Altar Guild since 2001, I have learned much about the "whys, hows, what ifs, wheres, whens and so muchs" of altar guild matters that helps to make people feel welcome to his table, as well as finding deeper meanings and perspectives in his teachings. However, I have seen a decline in attendance which is occurring in many volunteer organizations of which I'm a member. In 2001, there were about 60 in attendance at our annual meeting. This year there were about 30. We have always had excellent chaplains who lead us in our worship, musicians who enhance our time together, workshops that expand our creativity, and field trips that broaden our horizons. I don't think the attendance decline is about not offering informative, enriching programs, but possibly the cost, travel, and time elements. I know I value the short time that I spend at our sessions each year, returning home feeling spiritually refreshed and renewed. I hope to look at ways we can increase our membership and attendance, to share this special time with more of our devoted altar guild members from throughout Province IV.

Martha Noble Langston and I recently visited St. Mary's Sewanee Ayres Center for Spiritual Development as a possible venue for our 2020 meeting. It is a lovely place, near Chattanooga, and a bit more centrally located than Kanuga, but we didn't feel that it was suitable for our needs at this time. Another possibility is the DuBose Conference Center at Monteagle, TN, again near Chattanooga and convenient to the University of the South, which would be a wonderful place to visit. If you have any other suggestions for an alternate venue for our 2020 annual meeting, please let us know.

I feel privileged to have been elected to serve as president of Province IV for the next three years. I have an excellent team to work with. Vice-President Martha and I are putting together programs that will have practical information, as well as provide spiritual enrichment for those who attend. In addition, we are fortunate to have *Valerie Riley* as secretary and *Phyllis Bruce* as treasurer. *Sarah Hill* will be chairman of our Nominating Committee. *Peggy Curlin* will continue as editor of our newsletter, *Sacristy Sense*, *Regina Barber* and *Melva Morfaw* have agreed to serve as Hospitality Committee. Thanks *to* all. I look forward to working together with our Board to continue to provide a meaningful session for our members.

Our theme for our term of office is from *Ecclesiastes 3:1*: "There is a time for everything under heaven."

The program for the day included a presentation by *Lynn Hendricks* former NAGA President on the "Care of Linens and the Deconsecrating of Linens and Vestments." She brought a stole made by *Barbara Parks* from deconsecrated purificators that had been recycled. It was a way for members to see a wonderful use for linens that have become too worn for regular use.



Dr. Anne Blackerby gave a hands-on demonstration of "Baking Eucharist Bread." Members were provided a recipe and were able to see the entire process of baking bread appropriate for use at Eucharist.
